



## COLUMBUS CITY COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

**LIGHTING LINDEN ALLEYS:** Public Utilities Committee Chair [Zach M. Klein](#) is sponsoring ordinance 2009-2014, for the South Linden Alleys Street Lighting Project. Approximately 287 new street lights will be installed in alleys within the boundaries of East Hudson Street on the north, East 11th Avenue on the south, Cleveland Avenue on the east, and Interstate 71 on the east. The lights will be owned by the city and powered by American Electric Power.

**REBUILDING GLENWOOD:** Councilmember [Hearcel F. Craig](#), chair of the Recreation and Parks Committee, is sponsoring ordinance 2141-2014, for the demolition and construction of a new Glenwood Recreation Center. The new building will include a gymnasium, auditorium, exterior basketball courts, and a new parking lot. The structure will be more energy efficient and easier for staff to monitor, creating a safer environment for visitors.

**ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENTS:** Councilmember [Michelle M. Mills](#), chair of the Development Committee, is sponsoring ordinance 2167-2014, for brownfield assessment,

environmental site assessments, and an asbestos survey at 1610 East Oak Street, the Franklin Park Trolley Barn, to enable the site to be redeveloped. Funds for the work are provided by the city's Green Columbus Fund, which encourages sustainable building and redevelopment to produce economic and environmental benefits for Columbus and its residents.

**MCKINLEY COMPLEX:** Finance Committee Chair [Priscilla R. Tyson](#) is sponsoring ordinance 2145-2014, for the construction of the city's McKinley Complex. Several city agencies, including Infrastructure Management, Facilities Management, and Environmental Abatement, will be relocated to the facility in order to provide their services more efficiently and cost-effectively. The facility will be located near the compressed natural gas fueling station that the city is partnering with the Central Ohio Transit Authority to construct.

**COMMUNITY MEETING ON ISSUES 6, 7, & 8:** Council President [Andrew J. Ginther](#) encourages residents to attend a community meeting to learn more about Issues 6, 7, and 8. The next meeting will be held on Wednesday, October 1st, at the John R. Maloney Family Health and Wellness Center, located at 1905 Parsons Avenue. The meeting begins at 6pm.
