ANTI-VIOLENCE FESTIVALS: Recreation and Parks Committee Chair [Hearcel F. Craig](#) is sponsoring ordinance 0665-2014, for the planning and coordination of the Applications for Purpose, Pride, and Success program's 2014 Cap City Nights Festivals. Cap City Nights is an anti-violence initiative that provides live entertainment, outreach, educational activities, games, and workshops throughout the city. FIRE STATION IMPROVEMENTS: Public Safety & Judiciary Committee Chair [Zach M. Klein](#) is sponsoring ordinance 0903-2014, for general architectural and engineering consulting services for the replacement of the current Fire Station 2/3 at 150 East Fulton Street. The new station on East Fulton Street and the station currently under construction at 222 Greenlawn Avenue will help our firefighters protect the community for decades to come.

HELP FOR HOMELESS SINGLE ADULTS: Councilmember [Priscilla R. Tyson](#), chair of the Health & Human Services Committee, is sponsoring ordinance 0549-2014, which supports the Community Shelter Board's implementation of a new single adult crisis response system. The new system will help homeless men and women transition from homelessness to permanent housing. The ordinance will also support improvements to Rebecca's Place, a women's shelter on the East Side.

STREET RESURFACING: Public Service & Transportation Committee Chair [A. Troy Miller](#) is sponsoring ordinance 0919-2014, the third street resurfacing contract to come before Council this year. This contract will repair and resurface fifty-five city streets and construct 807 ADA curb ramps. The previous two contracts approved by Council will resurface a total of 210 streets and construct 1,145 ADA curb ramps when the work is complete. WELCOMING CENTENNIAL STUDENTS: Council is honored to be joined every year by student trustees from the Northwest Civic Association.
