


2012-2013 Columbus & Franklin County Seasonal Influenza Activity Weekly Summary (Week 43, Oct 20th – Oct. 26th, 2013)

Highlights

- In week 43 of 2013, most of the local influenza activity indicators increased compared to last week, with some indicators slightly above their baseline averages for this time of year.
- Geographic activity and local intensity designation (Click [here](#) for definitions) = SPORADIC, LOW
- Local medical facility labs reported 451 tests run with 10 (2.2%) positive results for week 43 of 2013.
- The percentage of ED visits for influenza-like-illness (ILI) and respiratory symptoms increased slightly compared to the previous week. The percentage of ED visits for ILI and respiratory symptoms are similar to and slightly above their weekly historical baseline averages respectively.
- The trends for the local over-the-counter medication sales being tracked were mostly higher (increase in cough and cold, thermometer, chest rub, pediatric anti-fever, adult anti-fever, and throat lozenge sales; decrease in electrolyte sales) compared to last week.
- During week 43, influenza activity remained low in the United States. Please [visit the CDC website for specific information](#) (National data is usually updated on Friday of each week).

CDC 122-Cities Mortality Reporting System: Pneumonia and Influenza (P&I) Mortality

In week 43 of 2013, 6.5% of all Columbus deaths were attributed to pneumonia and influenza (Figure 1). Nationally, 5.6% of deaths reported were attributed to pneumonia and influenza in week 43. This national percentage is below the national epidemic threshold of 6.3% for week 43.

Influenza Morbidity and Influenza-Like Illness (ILI) Reports

The preliminary week 43 percentage of local outpatient visits for ILI at sentinel medical practice reporting sites was <1.0% (2 reporting facilities). The week 43 percentage of Emergency Department (ED) visits for ILI symptoms increased slightly compared to the previous week (Figure 3) and is similar to the historic baseline for this week. Pediatric urgent care visits for ILI symptoms increased compared to the previous week and is higher than its historic baseline for the week.

Nationally, during week 43 of 2013, 1.2% of patient visits reported through the US Outpatient Influenza-like Illness Surveillance Network (ILINet), were due to influenza-like illness (ILI). The percentage is below the national baseline of 2.0%.

Laboratory Surveillance

During week 43 of 2013, reporting Franklin County sentinel medical facility laboratories tested 451 specimens, with 10 (2.2%) positive (Figure 4). The total number of tests done by local reporting labs from week 35 of 2012 through week 43 of 2013 is 3,080 with 31 (1.0%) positives (6 type A, 25 type B). Nationally in week 43 of 2013, WHO and NREVSS laboratories reported 3,241 specimens tested for influenza viruses, 145 (4.5%) of which were positive ([visit the CDC website for more info](#)). The last 3 weeks national breakdown by type and subtype from CDC is shown in Table 1 below:

ED and Pediatric Urgent Care Respiratory Visits

In the 43rd week of 2013, the percentage of all ED visits categorized as *respiratory* increased compared to the percentage seen the previous week and is slightly above its historic baseline for this week (Figure 5). Pediatric urgent care visits for respiratory symptom visits also increased compared to the previous week and is slightly above its historic baseline for the week.

Over-the-Counter (OTC) Medication Sales and Antiviral Prescriptions

In week 43 of 2013, trends for the local over-the-counter medication sales tracked were mostly higher (increase in cough and cold, thermometer, chest rub, pediatric anti-fever, adult anti-fever, and throat lozenge sales; decrease in electrolyte sales) compared to last week.

Figure 1: Percentage of Deaths attributed to Pneumonia and Influenza Columbus, Ohio 2013-14




Figure 2: Percentage of Local and National ILI Outpatient Sentinel Health Care Provider Site visits, 2013-14




Figure 3: Franklin County Resident ILI Defined* ED and Pediatric Urgent Care Visits, 2013-14, Franklin County, OH





Figure 4: Percentage of Local Reporting and National Laboratory Positive Influenza Tests by Week, 2013-14

Figure 5: Franklin County Resident Respiratory ED and Pediatric Urgent Care Visits, 2013-14, Franklin County, OH




Figure 6: Selected Number of Over-the-Counter Medication Sales, 2013-14, Franklin County, OH





Figure 7: Franklin County Confirmed Influenza Associated Hospitalizations by Hospital Admission Week (As of 4:00 PM, 10/29/2013)
