Milton Avenue Bicycle Boulevard



Description and Benefits: A bicycle boulevard is a roadway that allows all types of vehicles, but which has been modified to enhance bicycle safety. This project in 2008 resurfaced Milton Avenue from Kenworth Road to Delhi Avenue, Riverside Drive from Delhi to Como Avenue, and Delhi from Milton to Riverside and included on-street signage and pavement markings at regular intervals along the bicycle boulevard. Signals, curb ramps, countdown timers and signal-loop detectors for cyclists were upgraded at Milton & North Broadway. "Bike boxes" (bike staging areas at intersections) were added at the same intersection in October 2009.

Project length is 0.8 mile and its limits are from the north leaving the Olentangy Trail from Northmoor Park to Northmoor Place to Olentangy Blvd., south to Kenworth, east to Milton, south to Delhi, west to Riverside, south back to trail head at the Olentangy Trail.
