

Healthy & Green Cleaner


To make your own all purpose cleaner:

Recipe:

- 1 part white distilled vinegar
- 9 parts water
- 1 drop dish detergent

Directions:

First fill an empty spray bottle with 1 part vinegar and 9 parts water. Next add one drop of dish detergent. Screw the lid on the bottle and gently shake. Use as you would any all purpose cleaner.



To clean bathtubs, sinks, stove tops, toilets and other surfaces:

Recipe:

- Baking Soda
- All purpose cleaner (see recipe above)

Directions: Spray surface with all purpose cleaner, then wipe clean. Sprinkle surface with baking soda for extra scrubbing power. Wipe or scrub surface with a damp sponge, rag, or scrub brush.

Healthy & Green Cleaning Recipes

Tub and Sink Cleaner

- Baking Soda
- Healthy Homes Cleaner

Use baking soda as a scouring powder. Spray Healthy Homes Cleaner on porcelain fixtures then sprinkle with baking soda. Scour with a scrub brush. Rinse well to avoid a hazy film.



Toilet Bowl Cleaner

- Baking Soda
- Healthy Homes Cleaner



Spray Healthy Homes Cleaner in the bowl, then sprinkle with baking soda. Scrub with a toilet brush. Spray and wipe down the outside surfaces.

Drain Cleaner

- Baking Soda
- Boiling Water
- Vinegar

This recipe will free minor clogs and help prevent future clogs. Pour $\frac{1}{2}$ cup baking soda down the drain, then add 1 cup vinegar. Let fizz for 15 minutes, then pour hot water down the drain. Repeat if needed. If it's still clogged, use a plunger. If necessary, use a mechanical snake.



Window and Mirror Cleaner

- Healthy Homes Cleaner

Spray Healthy Homes Cleaner on the window or mirror. Rub clean with a lint free cloth or a crumpled sheet of newspaper.



Floor Cleaner

- Vinegar or Murphy's Oil Soap
- Water

Using a two sided bucket method (one side soap, one side rinse) or two buckets, mop with $\frac{1}{2}$ cup vinegar with a drop of detergent or Murphy's Oil Soap mixed with warm water. The clean vinegar odor will go away shortly after the floor dries.



Oven Cleaner

- Baking Soda
- Water

Not as toxic to you or a child. Mix 1 cup of baking soda with enough water to make a paste. Apply to oven surfaces and let soak. Use a scouring pad and scrub to clean. Try using a spatula or bread knife to remove larger food deposits. Spot clean your oven regularly; dirty ovens are less energy-efficient.
