Agenda Item 1: NACCHO ACHIEVE Update

1. Healthy Policies for Healthy Children Action Institute
 - There are about 32-34 registrants who are not on the ACHIEVE team and about 40 who are; it should be a nice mix of participants
 - Andrew Wapner will be discussing Policies, Systems, and Environmental Change
 - Dr. Pirie will be sharing the focus group results
 - Cheryl Graffagnino will be announcing technical assistance opportunities at the Institute. Only agencies who serve pregnant women and children ages 0-5 are eligible. 10 agencies will be engaged and can receive up to \$500 in physical activity, nutrition AND/OR breastfeeding resources.

Agenda Item 2: Cardinal Health RFP

1. The ECOP Steering Committee convened on April 19th, 2012, to discuss 2 Cardinal Health RFPs that Coalition members/organizations can apply for. The ECOP would be looked at as a focal point.
 - a. One RFP focuses on Project Management/Leadership; the other focused on Direct Services
 - b. Autumn has scheduled a meeting with Cardinal Health to see where the Coalition can fit in and to get more details about the RFPs
 - c. Both RFPs are projected to have a 4 year funding sources, with possible additional funding for evaluation
 - d. Programs can receive funding ranging from \$15,000-\$50,000
 - e. The RFPs are emphasizing multi-sector collaboration that look at Policies, Systems, and Environmental Change.
 - f. Members/Organizations interested in applying should contact Autumn Trombetta. Interested parties at the meeting included HCHW, CHA, AFC, YMCA, CUL, and WIC
 - g. The RFP is due May 18, 2012; Autumn will send the RFP out electronically

Agenda Item 3: Healthy Prenatal Subgroup Update

1. The Prenatal Subgroup has completed patient surveys
2. The Subgroup is working with Capital University Nursing Students to create a healthcare provider survey to inform the creation of provider education and tools
 - a. It was suggested that Ohio Nursing Association (Bob Holomuzki) could be a possible distribution list
 - b. Also suggested was the Council on Healthy Mothers and Babies (Grace Kolliesuah) as a list to gain survey feedback

Agenda Item 4: Tricycle Rodeos

1. These rodeos are a part of Neighborhood Pride and are targeting children ages 2-5
2. The dates are Friday, May 11th, and Wednesdays 5/23, 6/20, 7/25 and 9/19
3. The coalition brainstormed the different stations that could be a part of the rodeo
 - a. Helmet decorating station- Children take home helmets that they decorate with stickers, streamers, reflectors, etc.
 - b. An hour a day for play station- Children play with hula hoops
 - c. Water first for thirst station- Children receive a water bottle

Agenda Item 5: FeeDIn Study with Dr. Eneli and Andrea Lourie

1. Dr. Eneli and Andrea Lourie provided a brief presentation on the FeeDIn Study, a feeding dynamic intervention for regulation of energy intake.
2. The criteria for participants in the study are:

- a. Children must be ages 3-5 and have a BMI above the 85th percentile
 - b. No medical condition that affects eating or growth
 - c. No food allergies
 - d. No developmental delay
3. Families who participate will be compensated for their time. \$75 in cash at each visit, totaling \$225
