Agenda Item 2: ACHIEVE Update

Cheryl: The CAP is a culmination of data collection from this summer. We used the safe routes walkability checklist, in addition to our own playability checklist. We also completed CHANGE tools with a variety of organizations in several different sectors. We made efforts to combine these things and synthesize them into an actionable process. We used the key findings, combined with ACHIEVE's focus on policy, systems and environment (PSE) and created a two year plan.

1. Year 1: Tackle City of Columbus policies:
 - a. availability of food/pricing strategy
 - b. Breastfeeding policies
 - c. Healthy meetings/events
 - d. Take CHART team expertise up a notch
 - e. Smaller local mini action institutes (organizations would receive incentives)
 - f. Safety concerns: only saw people in 1 park, Rec & Parks is proactive & keeps them clean
 - g. Neighborhoods perceived as unsafe (infiltrate safety coalitions with early childhood PSE advocates to address these issues)
 - h. National Crime Prevention Council
 - i. Becoming involved in safety committees

Dr. Pirie: PRC & ODH are creating a PSE online training (3 modules approximately 30-45 minutes each)

Cheryl: Offered CHART as guinea pigs for training (**Noted Brad White for community policing)

Agenda Item 3: Child Care Center & Home Provider Preliminary Results

Refer to Sherry's slides. Discussion points:

1. What policies should be addressed first?
2. Should efforts be made with homes?
 - a. Issue of cost of childcare centers (range of pricing, childcare center is more money than homecare provider)
 - b. Issue of clothing being appropriate for kids to play in (bigger barrier in childcare centers than in homes)
 - c. Referral services
3. Are we going to be sharing this with the centers?
 - a. Dr. Pirie: Soon, in proper format, trying not to be number heavy
4. ODJFS: Ohio Department of Job & Family Services statewide policies
 - a. Issue of costs for homecare providers-only reimbursed low amounts \$2.14/lunch, \$1.00 breakfast, \$ 0.49/snack
 - b. Suggestion of breaking healthy meal down into comparable costs for childcare providers
 - c. Big P vs. little p (ODH policy vs. childcare center policies)
5. **Next Steps**
 - a. Grace: Will find someone in ODJFS or find other avenues
 - b. Bob: Action for Children/headstart (do trainings)
 - i. SUTQ-10 hour mandatory training and then electives
 - c. ODH and then take it to ODJFS
 - d. Work with CHA, AFC, etc. to discuss survey results
 - e. Arrange meeting with CHA, AFC, PRC, Grace
 - f. Also meet with ODH, Dr. Wopner, Melissa
